

# Follow this guide to extend your display



1

Connect your screens using a [HDMI](#), [VGA](#) or [USB](#) cable, depending on which ports your monitor has.

2

Click the **Windows logo** on the bottom left of your screen and search for 'display settings'.

3

Click '**Ease of Access display settings**' and then '**Additional display settings**'. You will see numbered boxes representing your monitors.

'Monitor 1' is your main screen. 'Monitor 2' is the screen or interactive whiteboard that you will display to your class.

4

Drag and drop these boxes to change the positions of your screens in relation to each other.

5

Once you are happy with the layout, click '**Apply**'.

6

Scroll down to the '**Multiple displays**' dropdown to view the screen display options.

7

Select '**Extend these displays**'.

8

You will now be able to drag your presentation mode window across to your second screen.

Connect your screens using a [USB-C](#) to [HDMI](#) cable.

2

Your screens will be in '**Extended display mode**' by default.

3

To adjust the position of your screens in relation to each other, click on the **Apple** logo followed by '**System preferences**'.

4

Select '**Displays**' and then '**Arrangement**'.

5

You will see two boxes representing your two monitors. The box representing your primary screen - your laptop - will have a white bar over it.

6

You can drag and drop these boxes to adjust their positions.

7

You will now be able to drag your presentation mode window across to your display screen.
